This certainty reduces administrative and compliance burdens that would otherwise interfere with employers' ability to offer uniform benefits to their workforce. Maintaining a clear and consistent framework is critical to the continued success of employer-provided coverage and the health of Americans it supports.

ERISA Enhances Access to Affordable, High-Quality Plans: As employers and employees face rising costs in care, ERISA helps employers use their scale to drive affordability while allowing them to tailor plans to respond to the health needs of their employees and families. This helps to ensure participants have access to the most innovative treatments, therapeutics and cures.

ERISA preemption led to the significant growth of employer-provided coverage, and it continues to be fundamental to the stability, affordability, and success of the system.
