Trade Means Growth for Wisconsin

International trade—exports and imports of goods and services—supports 690,000 jobs in Wisconsin, or about 1 in 5 total jobs in the state.

Key facts about trade and jobs:

- The share of Wisconsin jobs supported by trade has nearly doubled since the early 1990s.
- Jobs in export-intensive industries offer compensation that averages about 16 percent higher than other jobs.
- · Imports let American families stretch their budgets and help U.S. manufacturers keep costs down and competitiveness up.
- Over 8,700 Wisconsin companies exported in 2022. Nationally, 97% of trading firms are small-and medium sized enterprises.
- Since 2008, companies that import or export goods have accounted for 3 out of 5 new American jobs.

Wisconsin companies exported \$37 billion in goods and services in 2023 to more than 190 markets around the world.



America's FTA partners account for just 6% of the world's population but purchased 56% of Wisconsin's goods exports in 2023.

Wisconsin's goods exports to Belgium were \$895 million in 2023, an increase of over 150% since 2014.

Ireland was the top export market for services exports in 2023 at \$799 million.

Wisconsin's total goods and services exports increased by \$7.0 billion (23%) between 2014 and 2023.

In 2023, Wisconsin exported \$29 billion in goods and \$8.4 billion in services — a 10-year high for each.

Most services export growth has been driven by digital trade, which is allowing more Wisconsin companies to reach customers abroad more easily.

Wisconsin's top machinery exports in 2023 were outboard motors (\$453 million) and engine parts (\$347 million).

Wisconsin's top agricultural exports in 2023 were soybeans (\$667 million) and corn (\$265 million).

Wisconsin's exports of digitally tradable services reached \$5.5 billion in 2023.

Foreign-headquartered companies directly employ 130,200 Wisconsin workers.

British-owned companies employ the most Wisconsin workers (22,100), followed by Canadian-owned companies (17,600).

Each job at a foreign-owned company typically supports three other U.S. jobs indirectly.

In 2021, U.S. affiliates of foreign-owned companies employed 8 million Americans, exported \$412 billion in goods, and spent \$78 billion on R&D.
